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WHAT'S NEW FOR 2013?



Hebrew/Greek Classes: Justin Rogers, FHU faculty member, is one of the few members of the churches of Christ with training in Old Testament Hebrew. Join him for an introduction into the language of Moses and the Prophets. Dr. James Smeal and John Moore will offer Greek classes on both the beginner and advanced levels.

Missionary Rendezvous: Missionaries from all over the world are making PTP the highlight of their furloughs and training. Workers attended from ten countries last year, and scores of missionaries were in attendance. This year there is a new track of classes just for missionaries to go along with the evangelism track.

Mock Debate: David Lipe and Wesley Simons will present a mock debate on Instrumental Music in Worship. Learn how to show the teaching of God's Word on this vital topic and how to answer common arguments made to defend the instrument.

Public School/Homeschool: Whichever path you have chosen for educating your children, PTP will offer an emphasis for study and reflection. Richard Melson has been both a gospel preacher and public educator for decades. His will deliver a series on "How Parents and Christians Can Engage and Influence their Public School System." The ever-popular homeschool track will feature additional

classes this year, including a series by Cindy Madaris.

The Doctor Is In: Dr. Bill Battles, a faithful Christian with both medical and psychological training, will discuss such issues as depression, sibling rivalry, communication, the sexual relationship, parenting, and pornography.

Expanded Children's Program: One of the fastest growing PTP segments is the Children's Program. This year children ages 2-12 will have a class for every age, an amazingly talented faculty of teachers, and fun activities they will talk about for weeks after returning home.

Get Out of Debt Workshop:

Join Wes Hazel as he teaches biblical principles for money-management.

Sexual Abuse: PTP continues its practice of tackling the tough issues with Tabitha Barker's three-part series on sexual abuse. She is a thriving overcomer, and a faithful Christian. Ladies, don't miss these moving sessions.

The Begging Place: Becky Blackmon will lead women in a wonderful study of the power of prayer.

Healthy X 2: PTP is renowned for renewing the spirit, but this year an added emphasis will be made for improving the temple of the Spirit. Join an array of classes/activities designed to help us make our physical health as strong as our spiritual health.

Gadgets and Gizmos: Michael Hite, brotherhood tech guru, will be on hand to talk about how technology can be used to further the kingdom.



You have heard of a vacation, and lately stay-cations have become popular, but PTP gives the unique opportunity for a “pray-cation.”


